Bay Creek Neighborhood Association Meeting notes June 29, 2017

Overview of Meeting Process:

After introducing themselves to each other the participants clarified the purpose of the meeting, which was to discuss how BCNA meetings and interpersonal interactions could be improved. The meeting lasted two hours and was facilitated by City of Madison staff.

Participants were asked to generate individual thoughts on what they would like to see more of, less of and what they would like to continue as is in the workings of the BCNA. Small groups of participants reviewed individual comments and categorized themes in each of those areas. Then, a large group discussion was held to discuss themes and generate actions to address the themes.

In general, meeting participants expressed positive feelings about the BCNA and the good work of dedicated neighbors over the years. The rotating facilitation of the bi-monthly meetings was seen as positive and essential to the transparency and democratic process outlined in the by-laws of the organization. Continued outreach to new and existing neighbors on the work of the BCNA was seen as important to ensuring that the voice of the neighborhood would continue to be heard in City Hall.

Active discussion, participation in meetings, leadership committee and sub-committee work, and a focus on presenting the insights and recommendations of the neighborhood to the City and County, were seen as vital to the effectiveness of BCNA overall.
